Europe's non-stop biotech calendar

As the life sciences grow in significance not only in pharma development but also in the production of biobased chemical building blocks, the number of post-BIO events in Europe has skyrocketed. From partnering to scientific congresses, from product shows to technology offerings – this coming autumn is one long series of highlights that could have an impact on your business. Whether you're looking for a licensing partner, need financing or just want to find out more about the latest developments in R&D equipment and services, you'll find everything you need to know about what each event provides in this edition of the Euro Biofairs Compass.

In September, the emerging Baltic region will see the **Life Sciences Baltics 2014** in Vilnius (10-12 September). The mix of conference, partnering event and exhibition attracted more than 800 international attendees when it kicked off two years ago. Over 250 companies from all over the world – among them 100 exhibitors and 27 sponsors – had already confirmed by May that they would be participating. And **Biospain 2014** (24-26 September) organiser ASE-BIO also expects to achieve new records in terms of visitors and participating companies on the 15th anniversairy of Spain's main biotech event. Bio-based industry trends will be highlighted by market leaders in the field during the **European Forum for Industrial Biotechnology and the Biobased Economy** (30 September- 2 October) being held in Reims (France). Last year, the EFIB attracted more than 700 stakeholders, according to organiser EuropaBio, whose member associations are also hosting the 2nd edition of the **European Biotech Week** (6-12 October) to communicate the benefits of biotechnology to the public. The continent's most important meeting for pharma developers and suppliers, the **CPhI Worldwide**, will bring

the sector to Paris from 7-9 October 2014. In tandem with three other special events, the show that attracted 2,200 exhibitors and 34,000 visitors last year will have 20 "topical" zones ranging from APIs and biopharma to contract services and even packaging.

The partnering zone

Companies aiming to expand in the Far East would be well-advised to attend the BioJapan 2014 (15-17 October). This year, Asia's largest biotech event will feature over 220 presentations and sessions with top Asian executives. International cooperation and tech transfer in growing eastern European markets will be at the focus of **Bioinnovation** 2014, which takes place in Gdansk this year (October 20-21). That will be closely followed by the EBD's BioEurope 2014 partnering event (November 3-5), which provides the perfect meeting point for biotechs, investors and pharma executives in Frankfurt/ Main (Germany). Business, business and more business will be in the limelight at the 56th edition of the **euroPLX** meeting, which is aimed at business development executives. The popular partnering event will take place this time in mid-November (17-18) in the sunny Mediterranean city of Nice.

From analytics to bioeconomy

Staff at pharma firms shouldn't miss the chance to explore up-to-date analytics, bioanalytic and microbiology information available at PharmaLab Congress (November 19-20) - an event taking place for the second time in Düsseldorf/Neuss (Germany). Topics there will range from leachable/extractable impact on formulations to new regulatory requirements. Biomarker development in industry and academia will be in the limelight of the 4th Munich Biomarker Conference (November 25-26). And late in the year (December 2-3), the 3rd Conference on Carbon Dioxide as Feedstock for Chemistry and Polymers in Essen will illuminate the new paradigm of the CO₂ economy. Last year, organiser novalnstitut GmbH brought 300 players to the German city.

The biotech and pharma research and production sectors has seen average annual growth of over 22%, while more than 80% of the sector's products were exported. The success of the Lithuanian biotech industry is founded on the country's well-developed educational system, which includes 16 academic institutions and 15 competent R&D centers. With a talent pool of 15,000 researchers/ specialists and over 100 companies operating in the life sciences space, the country is on a fast-track to become one of Europe's top high-tech innovation addresses. To support development, €400m in investment into five research valleys has been secured by the Lithuanian government.

Coinciding in its 7th edition with the Year of Biotechnology in Spain and ASEBIO's 15th anniversary, BioSpain is the main biotechnology event in the country and the biggest country-based event in Europe. Since 2012, BioSpain has been a leading international biotech conference the fifth-largest globally in terms of partnering meetings and participating companies.

This year's fair has been conceived as a meeting point for the innovative healthcare community. The event will not only be aimed at health, pharmaceutical products or the biotech industry, but also at biomedical research centres – particularly at hospitals committed to technology transfer and research, which ASEBIO categorises as Entrepreneurial Hospitals. BioSpain 2014 has also incorporated a new 'Biolatam Showcase' module for providing continuity between editions of the Latin American version of the event. It is designed to be a 'display window' for that part of the world. We are also aiming to bolster the presence of companies in leading markets like those in the US and the UK, without neglecting important emerging economies such as Russia and Mexico.

350 companies and institutions from 20 countries have already confirmed they will be participating, and the event has so far registered over 100 exhibitors, 27 sponsors, 23 collaborating entities and around 100 international companies. This fall we expect to attract 2,000 participants, 10% more than in 2012, exceeding the benchmark of 800 companies and institutions from 40 countries set that year. 40 specialised funds from all over the world will be at the investors' forum alone, while leading figures from alliances involving pharma companies and a large number of biotech firms, as well as leading researchers from multiple disciplines, have already confirmed they'll be attending.

With 800 attendees expected, the 7th edition of the European Forum for Industrial Biotechnology and the Biobased Economy (EFIB) is one of Europe's largest and most important gatherings for the industrial biotechnology sector. With the adoption of the Common Agricultural Policy, the research and innovation programme Horizon 2020 and the regulation establishing a Joint Undertaking for Biobased Industries, important pieces of legislation have been put in place that will contribute towards the creation of a more competitive and sustainable biobased economy. However, key challenges remain, such as achieving global scale-up and financing biobased industries in their first commercial operations. These challenges will be addressed at this year's European Forum for Industrial Biotechnology and the Biobased Economy in Reims. The high-level plenary includes a French ministerial address from this year's host nation, complemented by the European Commission's take on the future of the European biobased economy. discussion on shale gas and how it is impacting investments and market development in petrochemical and biobased value chains – a talk featuring representatives from Shell and European Bioplastics.

Another plenary highlight features supplychain perspectives on collaboration and commercialisation with senior representatives from consumer products companies. Leading players will share their views on opportunities for improving the sustainability profile of industrial production, among them Coca-Cola and Unilever, Natureworks, DSM and Südzucker. EFIB also offers attendees the choice of sessions dedicated to innovation in industrial biotechnology, or focused tracks on financing the biobased economy, as well as an international 'policy-into-practice session' looking at successful scaleup around the globe. And on 30 September, workshops organised in collaboration with the Forest Technology Platform and the PharmaSea project will also take an indepth look at the wood-based bioeconomy and blue biotechnology.



Partnering in Japan

BioJapan, the largest biotech event in Asia, is taking place for the 16th time from 15-17 October in Yokohama. This year it will cover nearly all of biotechnology's wide spectrum of fields, and is expected to attract over 12,000 visitors, as well as 700 exhibitors from more than 25 countries and regions. The organisers also expect participants to take part in over 5,000 one-to-one business partnering meetings.

BioJapan is Asia's premier event for the biotechnology industry. It plays an important role in facilitating interactions among international companies and organisations, and also in creating new business opportunities. Each year, people representing these companies and organisations from Japanese and global pharmaceutical and biotech companies gather in Yokohama to exchange information on the latest trends in the industry. And the event continues to grow. This year over 700 exhibitors and 12,000 visitors are expected to participate in BioJapan, and a significant number of them will engage in partnering meetings (more than 5,000) that have been empowered by the organiser's matching system.

A Nobel Prize laureate, Professor Shinya Yamanaka (Director, Center for iPS Cell Research and Application) will also present an update of the latest progress in induced pluripotent stem cell research.

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

His first book "Building Biotechnology" is already used as a standard text in dozens of biotechnology programmes throughout the world. Many other interesting speakers from the US and Europe will also take part, and the event includes workshops for young scientists and consulting services for biotech companies.

In order to maintain the event's high standards and the availability of the "hottest topics in biotech", representatives from the Synergy Innovation Fund have proposed a new coalition of organisers made up of the Gdansk Science & Technology Park, the University of Gdansk and PRO SCIENCE Poland Ltd. Compliance trends

The laboratory congress "PharmaLab" began in 2013 with the goal of bringing lab employees in the pharmaceutical industry up-to-date on science and technology relative to developments, applications and validation in analytics, bioanalytics and microbiology.
